Card 9 - Lighting a Fire

Only light a fire if it is safe to do so and with an adult. Never light a fire in a dry forest. Instructions You will need:

Cotton wool

Flint & steel

Marshmallows

Thin sticks

Water

- 1. Cotton wool acts as good tinder (it lights from a spark). Place a ball of cotton wool onto a hard, dry surface.
- 2. Hold the metal rod close to the tinder, and quickly push the striker down the rod to create sparks. You will need lots of tries to get this right. Make sure you have water to hand.
- 3. Once the tinder is lit, gradually add your kindling (thin sticks) to keep the fire going.
- 4. Using a long fork or a long stick, toast your marshmallow over the fire. Eat and enjoy!



Spelling pattern:

This week, we are looking at the prefix 'un'.

- A **prefix** is a letter or letters added to the start of a word to change its meaning.
- 'Un' means 'not'. When added (as a prefix) it will give the word the opposite meaning.

For example:

unhappy This is the opposite of happy. It

means that you are not feeling

happy about something.
