

The buzz and enthusiasm generated by this day was palpable and we look forward to our next whole MAC training event on 6th January 2020.

St. Joseph's was one of four schools from across the Local Authority to achieve the highest accolade for its commitment to PE and School Sport. The Platinum Award for the National School Games



programme can only be awarded if the school has successfully achieved the Gold standard for five consecutive years. The Platinum Award is given to a school for two years. The School Games Crew was also established in 2018-19 which was supported by a Sport Educator linked to the school. The group of Year 6 pupils organised 'personal challenges' for pupils to complete at lunchtimes. This has also proved to be a successful strategy for children to be more active at break and lunchtimes too.

All these initiatives have helped to support the children at St. Joseph's to be healthier both physically and mentally.



St Nicholas Owen Catholic MAC Learning Journey

Within St Nicholas Owen MAC, we have always recognised that an appropriate and effective curriculum is essential for effective learning and have understood the need to get the curriculum 'right' within our individual schools. However, when Ofsted introduced their draft framework in May 2019, this sparked even further conversation amongst teachers and school leaders within our MAC. It provided a very positive and exciting platform for us to be able to consider the following questions:

What makes a good curriculum?

What's the balance between knowledge and skills?

What are Ofsted inspectors looking for when they talk about intent?

With these questions in mind, we embarked upon our MAC curriculum journey which we launched at a MAC wide Inset Day in June. Since then, we have collectively designed an overarching MAC statement of Curriculum Intent which can be found on our MAC and individual school websites. Our schools continue to work together to share expertise to develop a curriculum which reflects both our MAC intent and the contextual needs of individual pupils and the local community.

We take every opportunity to keep curriculum conversations a high priority at Director, Academy Committee, Principal, Curriculum Co-ordinator and school level and are acutely aware that our conversations about curriculum need to be much more than revising long and medium-term plans or explaining curriculum 'Intent' to Ofsted. We agree with Dylan William that 'curriculum is not just the collection of plans made for lessons, but the curation of all the experiences a learner can have during their time attending school'. We will keep our community updated with the many exciting developments as we move forward on our curriculum journey.
