<p><u>Matthew's Gospel</u> Jesus asks John to baptise Him John doesn't want to but obeys Jesus and God. He thinks Jesus should baptise him. Heaven opening Dove and light God spoke "This is my beloved Son whom I am pleased"</p>	<p><u>Mark's Gospel</u> Doesn't mention Jesus asking him, just mentions the baptism Heaven opening Dove – spirit Doesn't mention light God spoke "This is my beloved Son whom I am pleased" Mentions going to the desert</p>
<p><u>Luke's Gospel</u> Said that Jesus prayed in the water Heaven opening Dove – spirit Doesn't mention light God spoke "This is my beloved Son whom I am pleased"</p>	<p><u>John's Gospel</u> John the Baptist's testimony/version Water Dove Holy Spirit "And I tell you , He is the Son of God"</p>
