






was born in Venice, Italy in 1678.

priest, teacher, conductor and composer

His nickname was 'The Red Priest' because of his curly red hair.



Don't be fooled by the picture....he was wearing a wig!

Although he wrote over 800 pieces of music, they was rarely played before his death in 1741.





Many of Vivaldi's works were lost or hidden a long time ago.

His flute concerto (con-cher-tow) was discovered only 10 years ago in Scotland.

Vivaldi died in 1741 and was buried in the same place as Mozart, in Vienna.
