In my Horn Concerto, the **same melody** is repeated again and again with different tunes in between.

Listen carefully!
Sometimes, the repeating melody is a bit harder to hear.

In my Horn Concerto No.4 it sounds like there is a conversation between the horn and the rest of the orchestra.

Task: Make up a conversation with a classmate or family member e.g.

'What are you having for dinner today?'

'I'm having pizza and chips.'



Now, can you clap or tap the rhythms of your words as you say them?

Try again, but this time, just clap or tap the rhythms without saying the words.

And again....play the same rhythms on untuned percussion (drum, tambourine, table top, cup)
