Topic: Jesus: Light of the World and Beloved Son.

Focus: Study some important stories about the life of Jesus and the revelation of his presence in the world.

Topic: The Old Testament: Moses – King David

Focus: study some important stories about Moses and God's relationship with the people of Israel.

English – Reading

Discussions, Book Talk and questions based around our class reader: How to train your dragon by Cressida Cowell.

Along with looking at linked extracts from Black Dog by Levi Pinfold, Ravi's worry by Tom Percival and Women poets including Emily Bronte, Ann Ridier and Amy Lowell.

Music

Topic: Roman songs

Focus: Perform a Roman assembly including acting scenes and singing.

Computing

Topic: Logo

Focus: Embed instructions for a computer to follow, creating interactive logos that differ in shape and size.

English - Writing

Topic: How to Train Your Dragon

Focus: Write a non-chronological report on your own dragon using descriptive devices to describe its appearance, habitat and features.

Topic: Cinquains (poetry)

Focus: Look at the structure of a cinquain and write own poem about their favourite animal using alliteration.

Science

Topic: States of Matter

Focus: Learn the properties of a solid, liquid and gas and how to change from one state to another. Learn about the water cycle and the processes of evaporation and condensation.

Maths

Topic: Multiplication and Division

Focus: Multiply and divide up to 4-digit by 2-digit numbers using standard written methods.

Topic: Length and Perimeter

Focus: Estimate and measure perimeters of compound 2D shapes.

Focus: Learn new vocabulary for objects that you find in the classroom and how to answer the question 'What is in your pencilcase?'

PSHE

Topic: Relationships

Focus: Learn how healthy relationships are established with friends and family, and what to do when relationships are not going as planned.

Geography

Topic: Plants of the World

Focus: Discover weird and wonderful plants of the world, studying flora in all seven continents. Locate continents and countries on a world map, identify climate zones and biomes (and the plants that grow in them) and explore ways in which humans use plants.

Art

Topic: Pattern and tessellation

Focus: Learn about the artist Esther Mahlangu. Create a tessellating pattern using bold colours and both straight and curved shapes.

Focus: Participate in swimming sessions at the Crystal Leisure Centre
