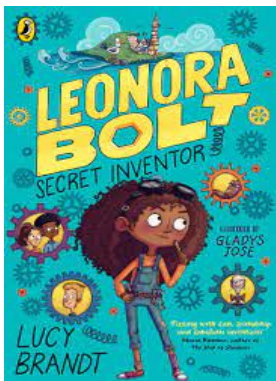


# Spring into a book

### Books for readers in LKS2

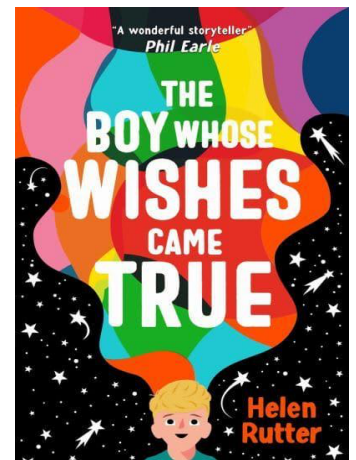


Fizzing with fun, friendship and fabulous inventions, this is an epic STEM-themed adventure about believing in your brainpower - and yourself!

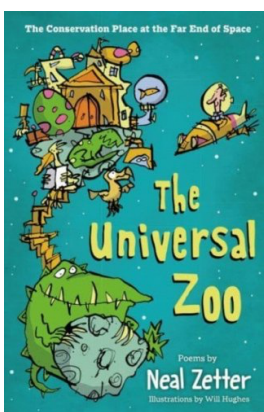
