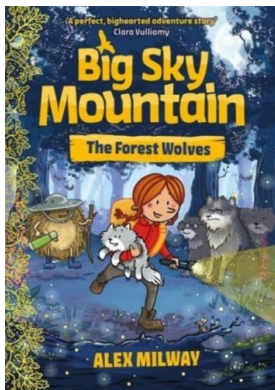

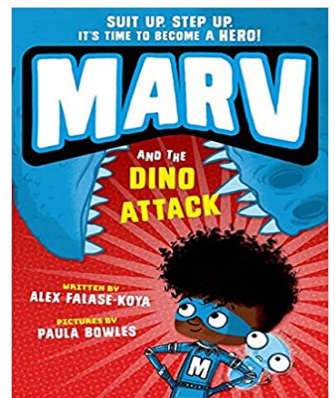
Book recommendations for Easter

First Chapter Books

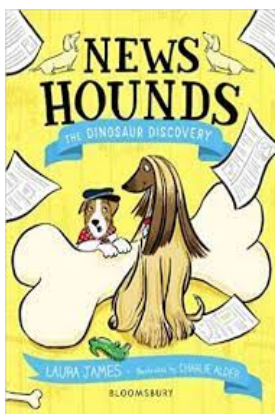
