Monday 8th February Reading

People didn't start building houses until the middle period of the Stone Age. They were very different to houses of today, but there are some similarities. Try to think about what is different and what might be the same as you read on and learn about Stone Age houses.

A Single Room

Stone Age houses seem to have only had a single room. Everything happened in this space.

Beds

There were often a couple of beds in each house. These owould have been made from wooden pallets topped with fur or fleece. They might also have been edged with stone.



△ Roof

Some houses were topped with thatch roofs. Others had stone roofs like the one in the picture. The most critical thing was to make sure it was watertight and kept in as much heat as possible.

All of the houses found at Skara Brae had stone dressers at the back of the house. These were used to store things. Other houses have been found with similar things inside. This shows that Stone Age people had possessions that they wanted to protect.

Fire Pit

Fire pits were built in the centre of the house. This ensured that heat could rise to the roof. The whole house could be heated this way. The fire would also have been used to cook food and to ward off animals.

Stone Walls

The walls of Stone Age houses were often made of stone. They were intricately slotted together to make them very strong and weather-proof. Some were coated with a layer of mud or clay. Shelves would have been built into the walls. Small windows would have been important for ventilation.


