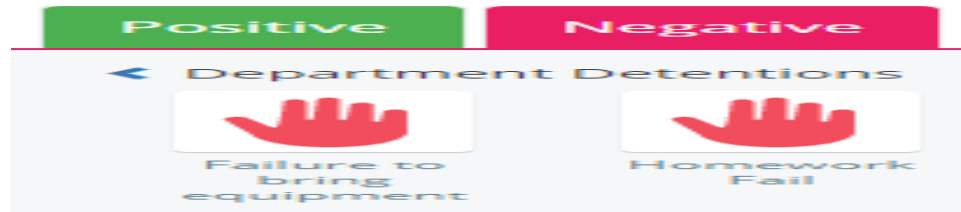


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How do I organise myself for each day?

- With so many different lessons and a 2 week timetable, there is a lot more responsibility on you being organised and bringing the right equipment for each day.
- Not having the right equipment could lead to a negative behaviour point!



- You will have different books for each subject and unlike in primary school where they are kept in school with your teacher, YOU are responsible for them. The teacher will only usually collect them in for marking.
- Some lessons will also require specialist equipment, e.g PE kit for Games.
