

Design and make a model of a house inspired by Hundertwasser. Remember bright colours, wavy lines, stripes and nature. Try using toilet roll tubes. See slide no.8 for inspiration.

Hide some treasure in different parts of your house or garden. Make a map (including a key) for a family member to use. Write some clues to direct your family to the right places.

Building transformation

Draw some basic blocks of flats (print or copy slide 6). Now imagine you are Hundertwasser. What changes would you make? Change your building so it looks like one of his (Slide 7 for help)

What's in the bag?

Ask a family member to put an item in a bag. Can you guess what it is by touch only? Try this again by putting small objects in a cup and shaking them? Can you guess what they are from the sound?

Go on a walk in your local area. How many things from the spotting sheet (slide no.3) What can you see? When you get back, make a simple map of your journey including physical features (hill, river) and human features (houses, shops, roads).

Make a fact file about Hundertwasser. Include a picture of him and details of what he liked to design and paint. (See example on Slide no.5)

Five Senses Hunt

Look around your house (and in your garden). What can you see, hear, touch, smell and taste? Can you find 5 objects for each sense? Draw and label each one.

Where do you live?

Copy or print an outline of the UK. Can you find Stourbridge? Label England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland. Have you visited anywhere else on holiday? Can you find it?

Hide and Seek


Can you spot, circle and label the features (windows, trees, bright colours, wavy lines, onion domes) in one of Hundertwasser's buildings? (Slide no.4)


He liked onion domes.




He made a feature of windows, each one a different shape or colour.




He loved bright colours.

He liked wavy lines because it reminded him of nature.





He liked to design buildings with trees inside or on the rooftops. When he painted trees, they looked like lollipops.
