

Homophones and Near Homophones

Here are this week's spellings to practise.




Homophones

Homophones are words that sound the same but are spelt differently.

We need to hear, read or write them **in a sentence** to know which spelling to use.

These words are all homophones...








Can you write a sentence that uses more than one homophone?

Near Homophones

Near homophones are words that sound similar but are spelt differently.

Depending on a person's accent, these words can sometimes sound slightly different. Some people pronounce them the same.

These words are **near** homophones...



There Their They're

Homophones are words that sound the same but have different meanings. The words there, their and they're are homophones.

There – is used when referring to a place. It is also a pronoun and is used when making a statement. Tip – there contains the word 'here' within it, another 'place' word. This will help you to remember the correct homophone.

For example:

I saw a spider over there.

There are two cats.



Their is used when referring to possession. It means belonging to someone or something.

For example:

Their dad fell asleep.

They got **their** bags.

They're – is short for 'they are'.

For example:

They're playing at the park.



They're at the cinema.





