Dear Parents/Carers,

Re: Full Opening from September 2020

We are delighted that we will be welcoming back all children to St Joseph's in September. I would like to thank staff, parents, children, the Academy Committee and the Board of Directors for all their hard work and support during these very challenging times. It certainly has not been the school year we planned for! It is such a shame that Year 6 did not finish their time at St Joseph's in the way we would have hoped, but I wish them all the best in all they do in the future and thank them for being such an amazing year group.

You will have received a letter from Mrs Horan on behalf of the Board of Directors with information about the logistics of the full opening of school from September. This letter details specific information for St Joseph's School.

September 2020

St Joseph's intends to fully open from Tuesday 1st September 2020 and the arrangements for this transition are as follows:

Friday 18th September Reception in school full time

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What are the start and finish times and what entrance will we use?

We ask that parents maintain social distancing and not gather in groups. Please follow the markings and signage when moving around the school site. Only one parent is allowed to drop off / pick up their child. Please note that the start and finish times for the first two weeks for Reception have been altered slightly from the information shared in the recent presentation. However, the staggered start and finish times will be reviewed regularly.

Please ensure children wash their hands before they come to school in the morning and again when arriving home.

Will the kitchen be open?

We are planning for the kitchen to be open and provide school dinners. Universal Infant Free School Meals will still be provided for all Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children. There will be provision for Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 to have hot school dinners – or they can bring in a packed lunch from home if they wish.

What will we need to bring to school?

Children must bring in a full water bottle.

Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 will need to bring in a small pencil case (pen, pencil, rubber, ruler, sharpener and pencil crayons) which will be kept on their table.

Reception, Years 1 and 2 will be provided with stationery.

Children can bring in a small bag if necessary.

All children need to wear full school uniform.

On the days children have PE lessons, children will need to come into school in their PE kits (and a tracksuit).

How will I make contact with school?

Please phone the school office to make an appointment.

What will my children be learning?

The children's well-being is paramount. We will be focusing on PSHE activities (including The Rainbow Hour, Five Footsteps to Well-being and DPA music activities). We will also be focusing on English and maths. We will review this at half term.

Will there be any trips?

At present there are no educational visits planned before half term. We will continue to review this.

Will there be before and after school clubs?



What should we do if there is any infection?

We must engage with the NHS Track and Trace process. Please let us know straight away if your child has a new continuous cough, a high temperature or loss of taste and smell. Arrange for a test straight away and let us know the results as soon as you have them. If bubbles, or the whole school, closes, there will be access to remote learning.
