Golden Jubilee at Our Lady of Fatima Catholic Primary School

Our Lady of Fatima Catholic Primary School celebrated its 50th anniversary in 2017. Founded in 1967 in Harborne to serve the parish of Quinton, the school was built to cater for the growing demand

for Catholic school places in the area.

When it opened its doors on the 4th January 1967, the school had a Headteacher, four class teachers and 64 pupils. The official opening was later that year on 13th May 1967 by the Right Reverend Joseph Cleary, Bishop of Cresima, exactly 50 years after the apparition of Our Lady of Fatima, in Portugal.





To kick-start the celebrations in March, the school paraded through the streets of Birmingham on a 50ft long lorry decorated in school colours to celebrate St

Patrick's Day. Over 100 school children and their families celebrated this wonderful event and the school was awarded the coveted prize of 'Best Float 2017'. After celebrating the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima in May, Year 3 and Year 5 hopped aboard the open top 'Birmingham Buz' for a historic journey around the city.



Retirement of Mr Ted Hammond

After twenty-six years of service, Mr Hammond retired from Hagley Catholic High School at the end of the Summer Term. Mr Hammond joined the school at the start of the 1990s as one of the Deputy Headteachers, before taking on the role of Headteacher in 2001. His career saw many highlights and changes in the school community, including several OFSTED and Archdiocesan inspections which, in 2011, secured Outstanding judgements, the acquisition of Specialist Arts Status in the early 2000s and a seemingly ever-expanding school site, including the addition of new buildings.

Mr Hammond's retirement was marked by two community events: a celebration of Mass and High Tea in school, with his current and former colleagues and a parish Mass at Our Lady & All Saints, Stourbridge, enabling the wider community to mark this

impressive milestone. Bishop David McGough celebrated the Hagley Mass and was joined by seven other priests, all of whom had a special connection with Mr Hammond during his time at the school: a testament to the work he accomplished. Both events were well attended, with the Mass in school catered for by the GCSE Food & Nutrition group members, who baked and made an impressive plethora of canapés, pastries & cakes. Hagley Catholic High School would like to thank everybody who contributed to Mr Hammond's retirement gift fund, which enabled the purchase of Lifetime Membership of the National Trust for him. Of the gift, Mr Hammond said **"I have always supported the work of the National Trust and enjoyed doing so for many years. I am very humbled and grateful to receive this gift, and every time I now visit, I shall remember my friends at Hagley with fondness."**
