



## Year 2 Home Learning

- ✓ Please complete the paper copies of home learning that Mrs. Riley has prepared for you.
- ✓ Look at the Maths Learning Grid on the “Our Community ‘ area and pick one activity to complete every day
- ✓ I will be adding Homework activities to Education City which will be updated regularly. They will also include “Learn Screens” which are like the teaching and learning of a school session and there will be “Activities” which is where the children show their understanding through completing an online task.
- ✓ Continue to learn/revise your times tables. You need to know your 2, 3, 5 and 10 times tables. Whilst online games help you practise your tables, the best way to learn them is to chant them over and over. Once you know them in order, ask someone to test you on them out of order! Then try to create fact families to go with each one.
- ✓ Please revise telling time and problem solving with money – these are life skills that can only be consolidated at home! You should be able to tell the time to o'clock, half past, quarter to and quarter past. Once you can do that, try telling the time to the nearest 5 minutes. You should also practise playing with toy money and calculating change from £1.00
- ✓ **Continue to READ!** Comics, joke books, newspapers, poems, information books, fiction and non-fiction are all reading materials!
- ✓ Use the websites below for extra learning about whatever else takes your interest.
- ✓ Many museums and even zoos offer virtual tours which can be fun to explore. Look at a couple. Which was your favourite? Write me a postcard to explain your choice.
