




Activity 3: Vocabulary challenge

Talking Time

In the story on Thursday evening, the wombat discovers that the hole she'd chewed in the door was 'curiously resistant' to her paws. What does 'curiously resistant' mean. Talk to your grown up about your ideas.







It's all about the words!

Activity 3: Vocabulary challenge



'curiously' means strange, unusual or unexpected.

'resistant' means not easily changed or damaged.

In this context, 'curiously resistant' means that the wombat was surprised that her paws could not re-open the hole!



Think about it

In the story, wombat says that 'On Sunday' the humans 'failed to understand my simple request' for rolled oats.

The word 'request' means 'demand'. It is used as a noun here

but it can also be a verb.

Example:

I have made a request.

I requested to sit next to Gabriella.

Noun – person place, thing or idea.



Or it could be written by another Australian animal, like a kangaroo, a possum or a platypus, an echidna, a cassowary or a kookaburra.

Get mud or water on something clean

Eat or drink something being kept for a special occasion

Make a lot of noise when it is quiet

Leave fur or hair in the wrong place

Make a horrible smell!


