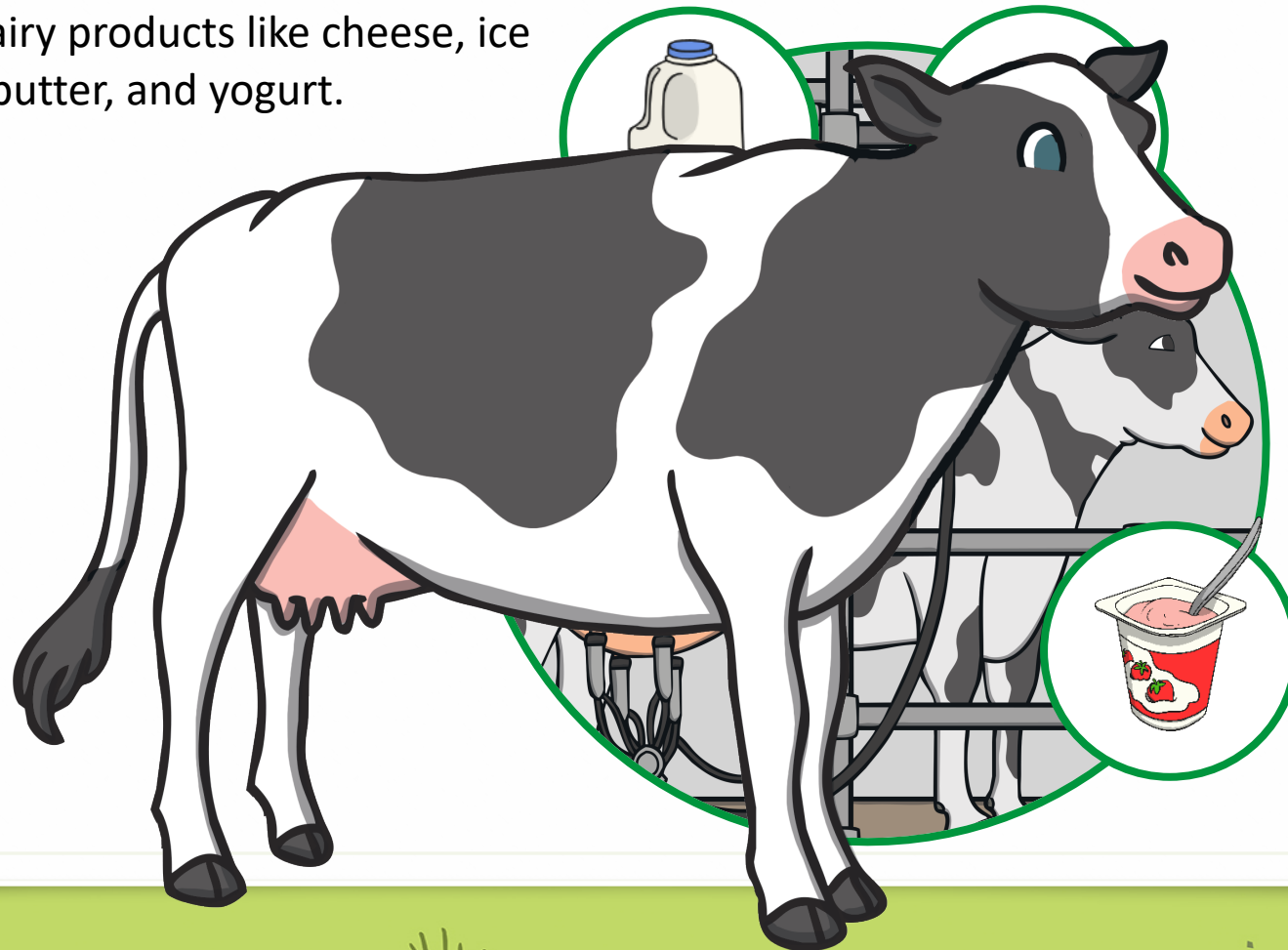

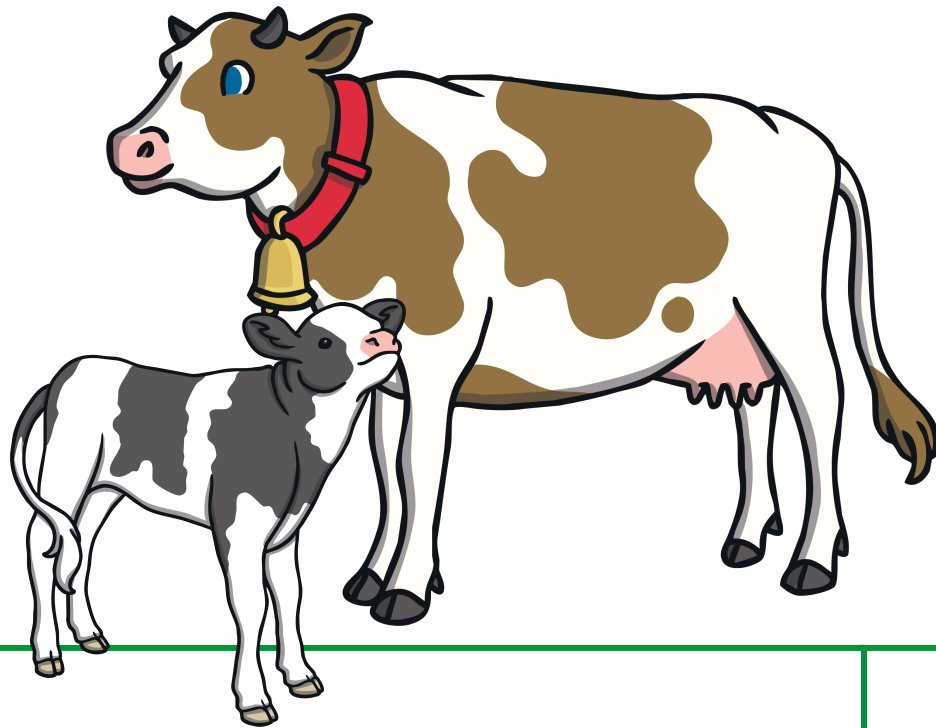
Cows

Cows live on a farm. They give us milk that we can drink. Milk is also used to make dairy products like cheese, ice cream, butter, and yogurt.

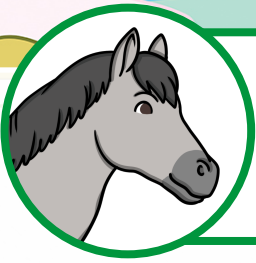

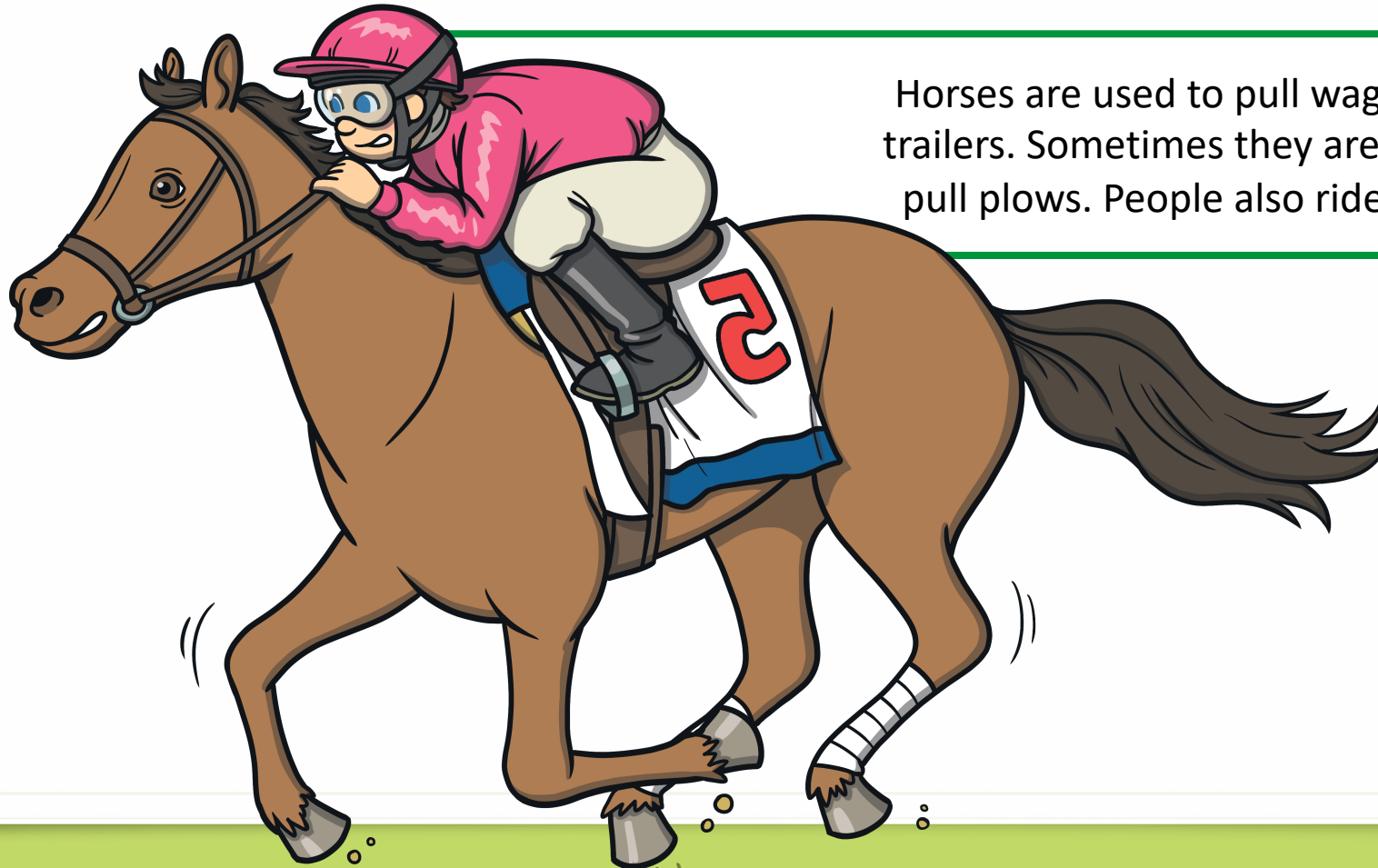

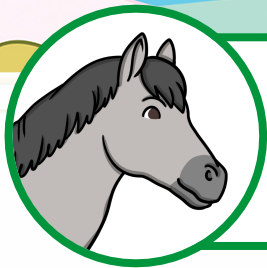


Horses

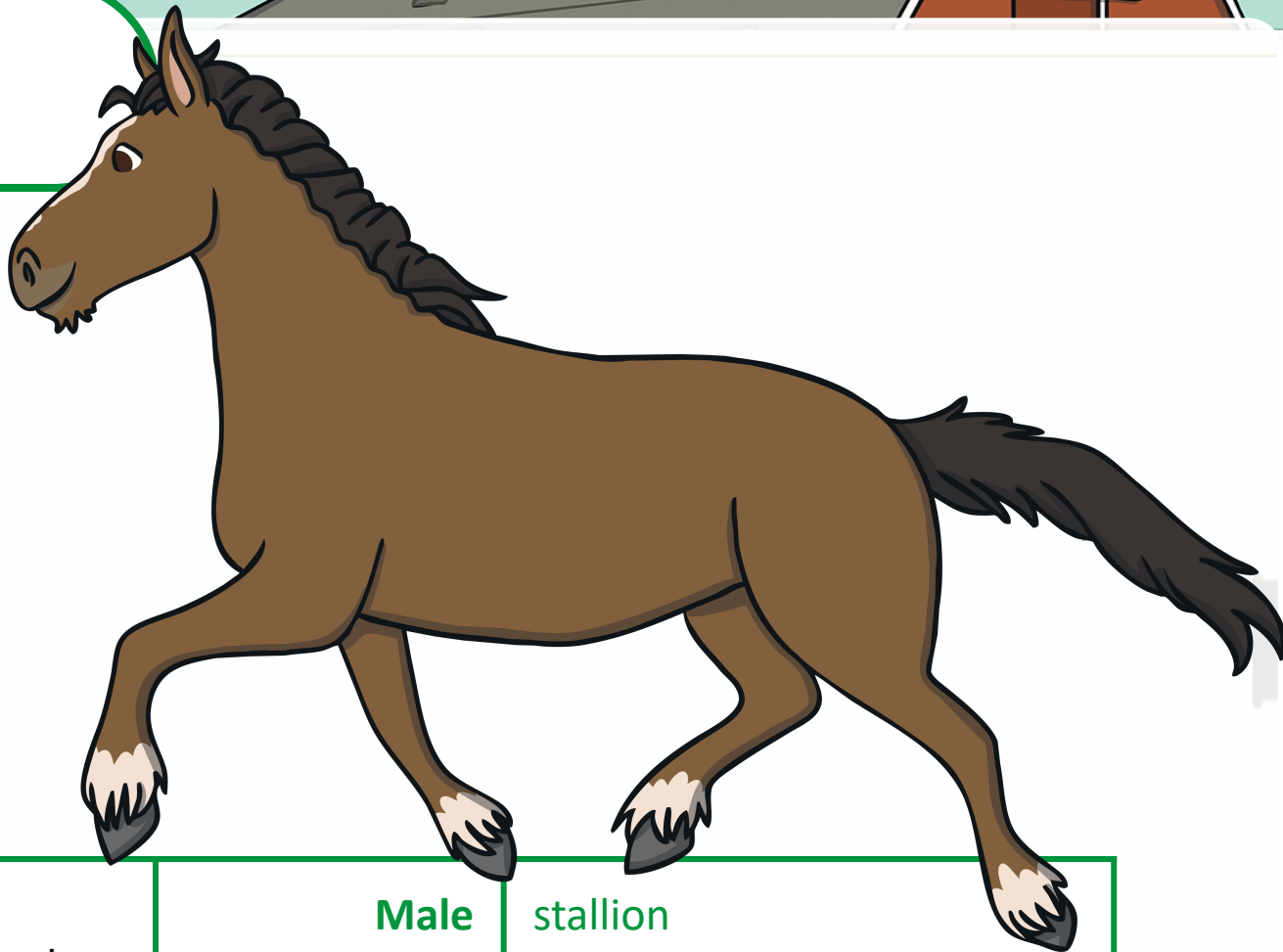
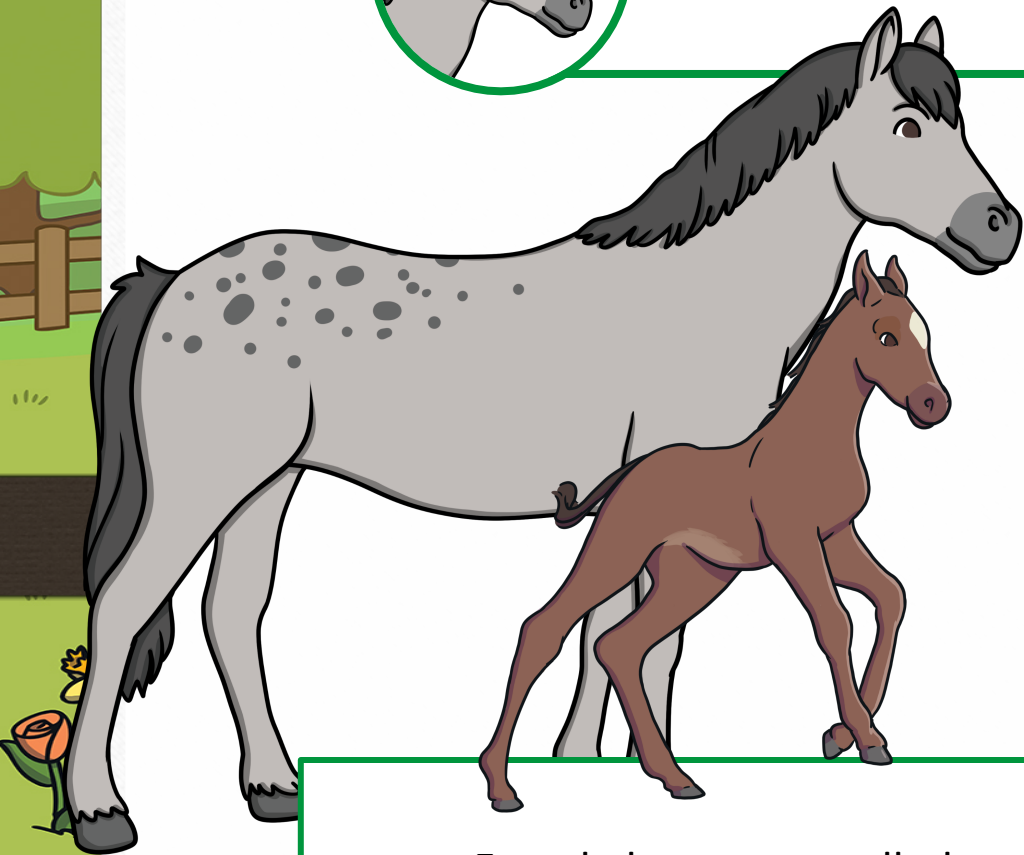
Horses live on the farm and help the farmer.



Horses are used to pull wagons and trailers. Sometimes they are used to pull plows. People also ride horses.

Female horses are called mares, male horses are called stallions, and baby horses are called foals.

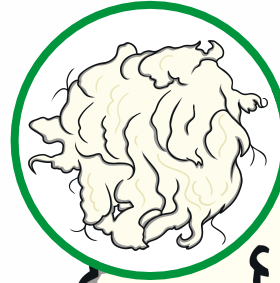


Sheep

Sheep are raised on a farm for their wool, meat, and milk.

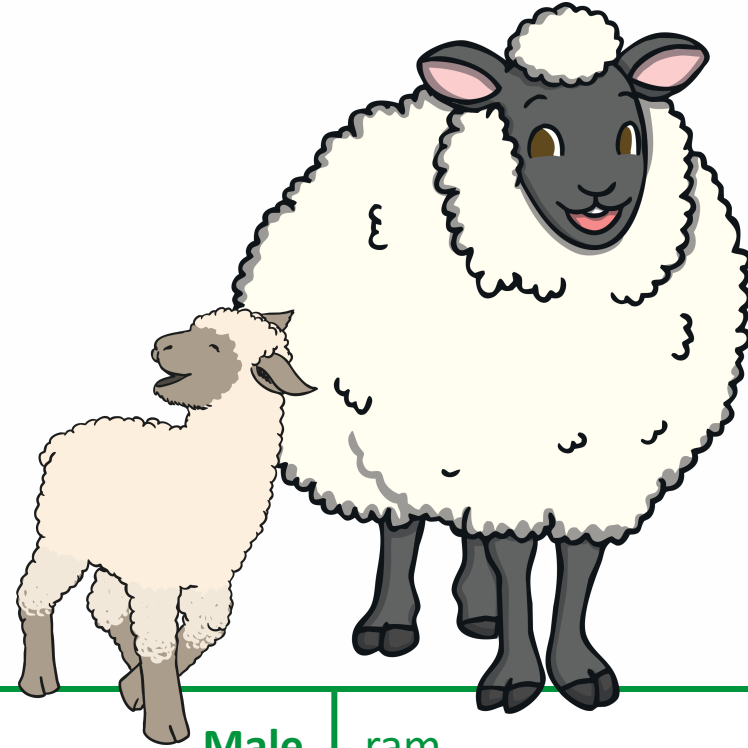
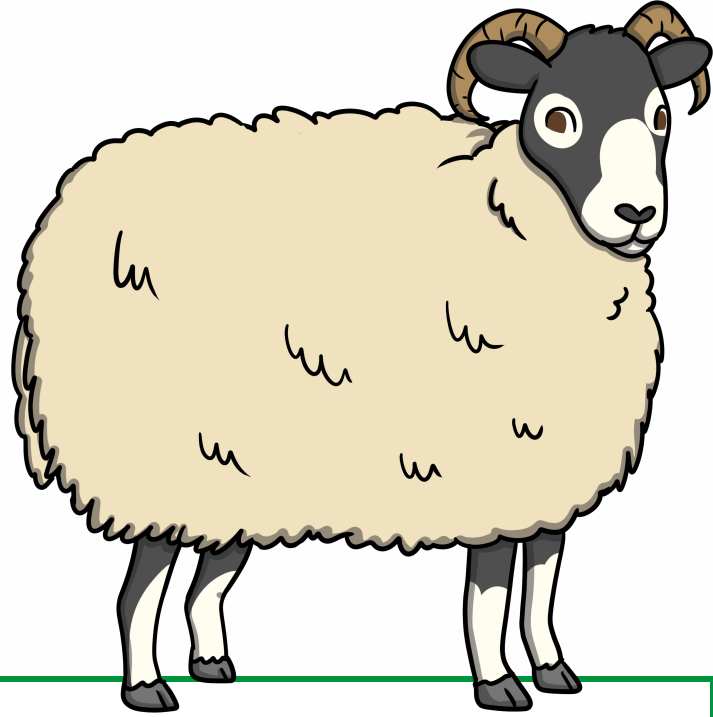
They are happiest when they live together in a group called a flock.

A sheep's wool coat is called a fleece. When a sheep is old enough, it has its fleece sheared off. The warm wool is used to make things like blankets, sweaters, or socks. Their fleece will grow back.

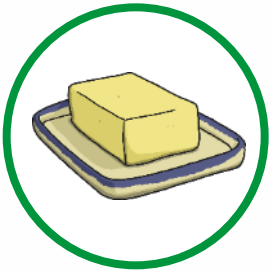
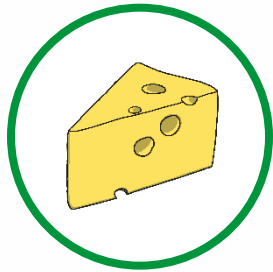
A female sheep is called a ewe. A male sheep is called a ram. Baby sheep are called lambs.

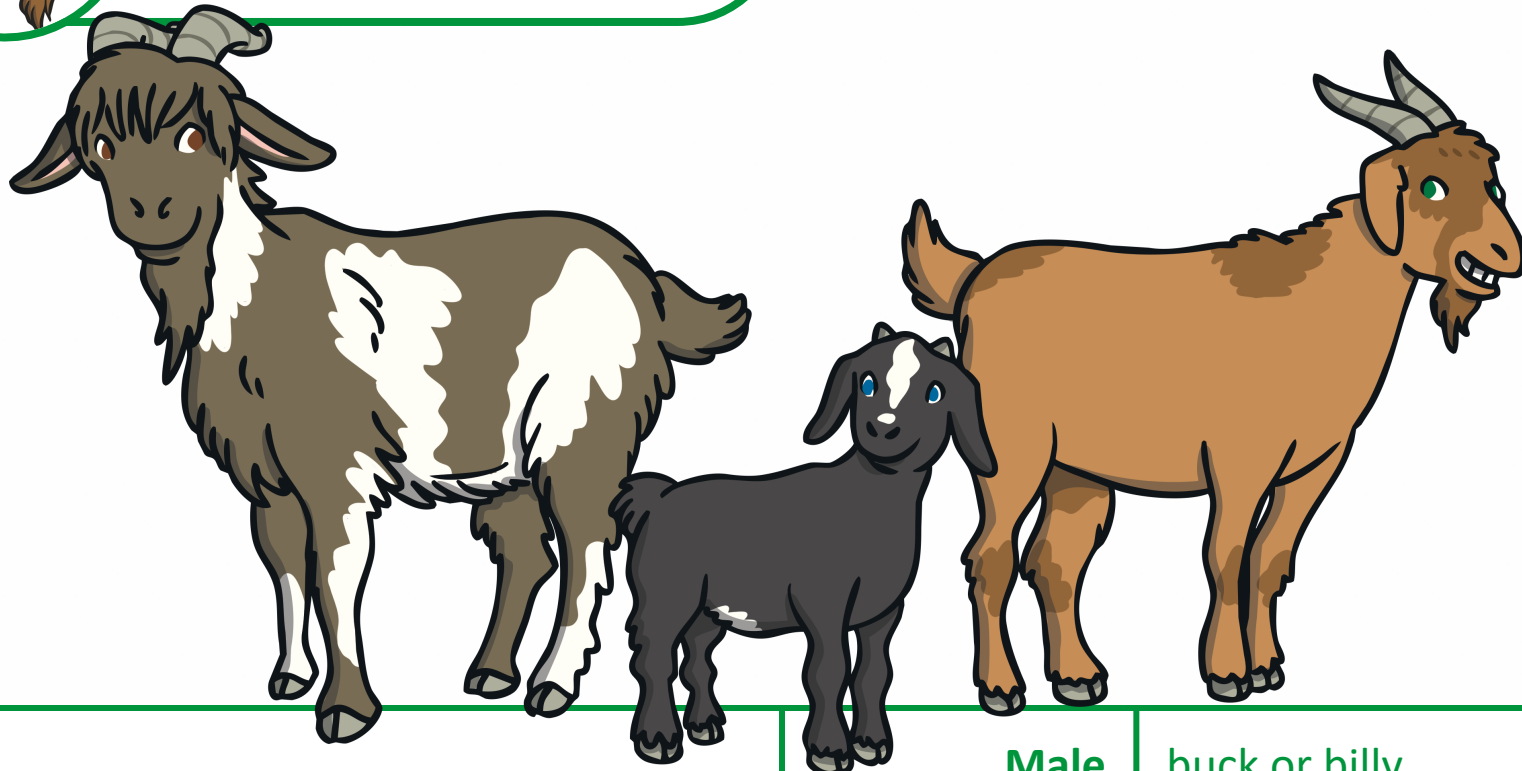
Goats

Goats live on a farm too. They can be milked, just like a cow. Their milk can be used to make butter, cheese, yogurt, and even soap.

A female goat is called a nanny or a doe.
A male goat is called a buck or a billy.

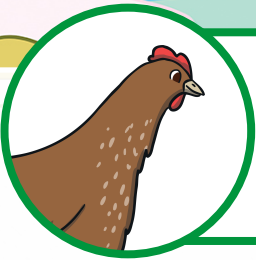

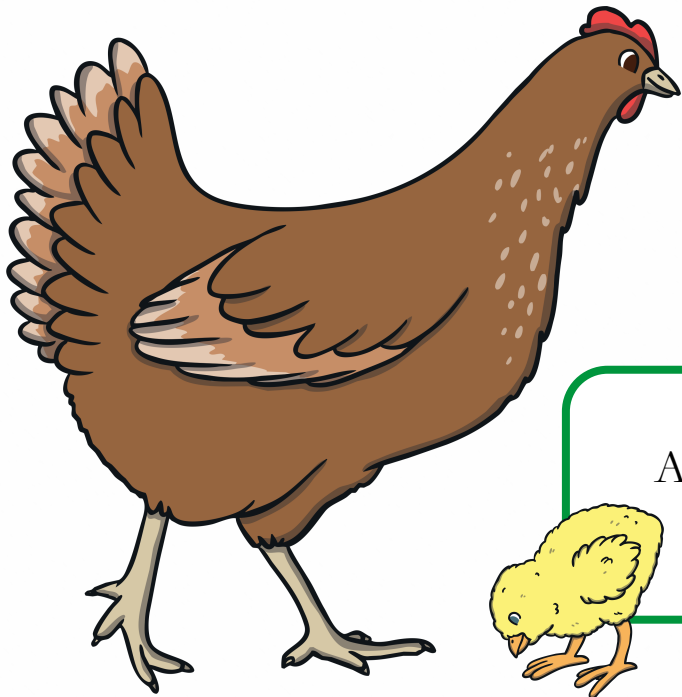

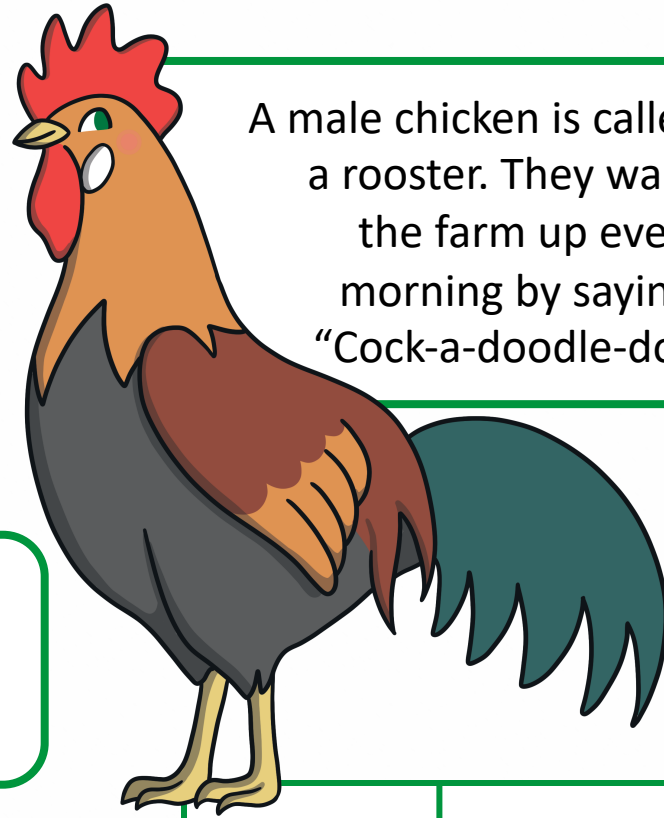

Chickens



A baby chicken is called a chick.

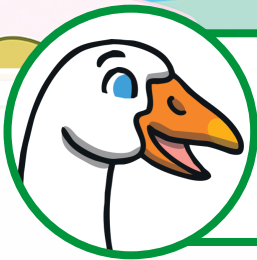


A male chicken is called a rooster. They wake the farm up every morning by saying, "Cock-a-doodle-do."

A female chicken is a hen.
Hens lay 1 – 2 eggs each day.

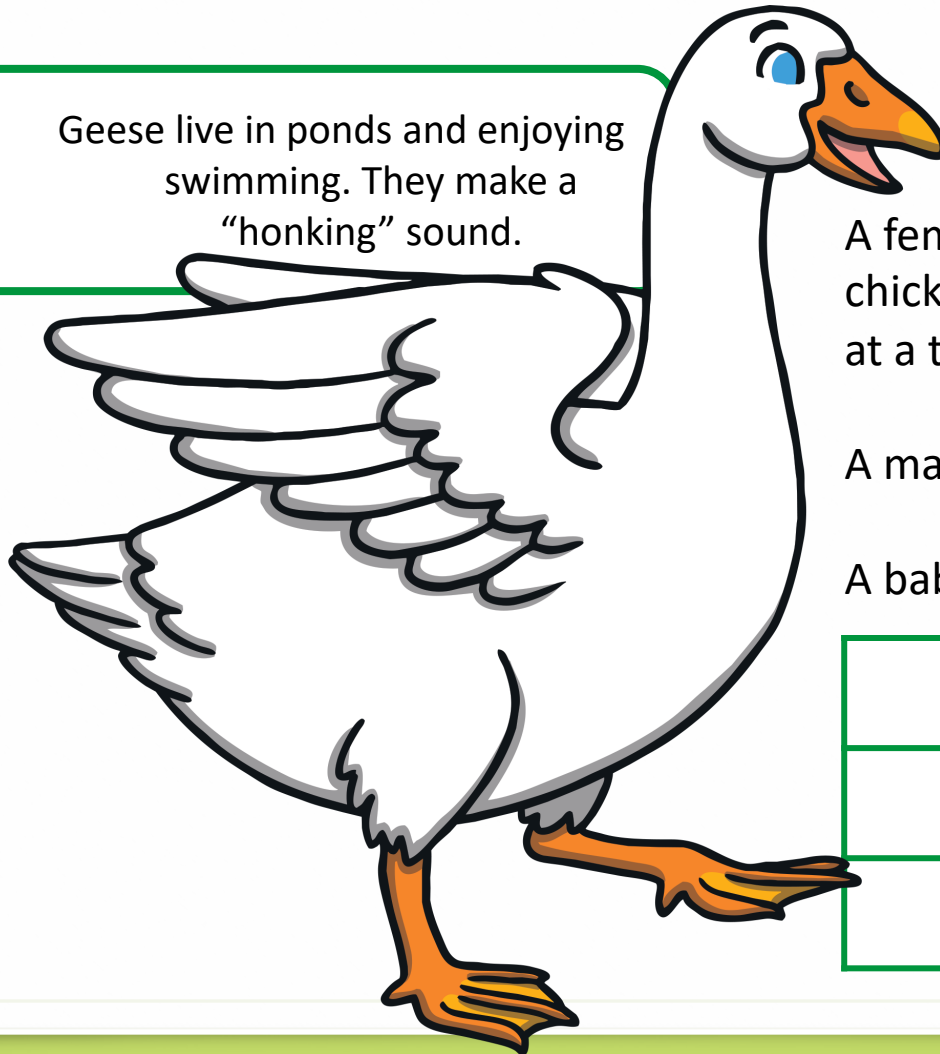

Geese

Geese live in ponds and enjoying swimming. They make a "honking" sound.

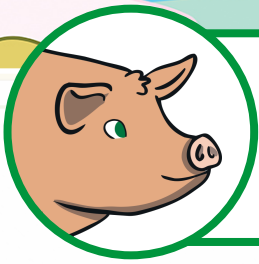


A female goose lays eggs, like a chicken. She will have 4 - 5 goslings at a time.

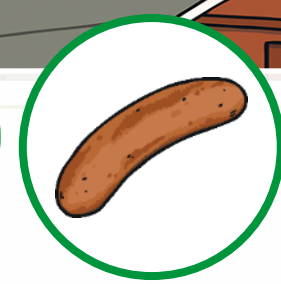
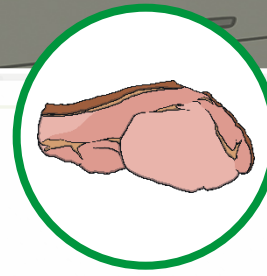
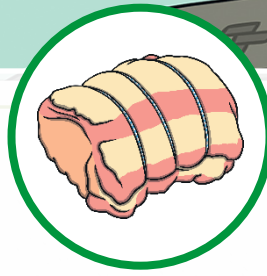
A male goose is called a gander.

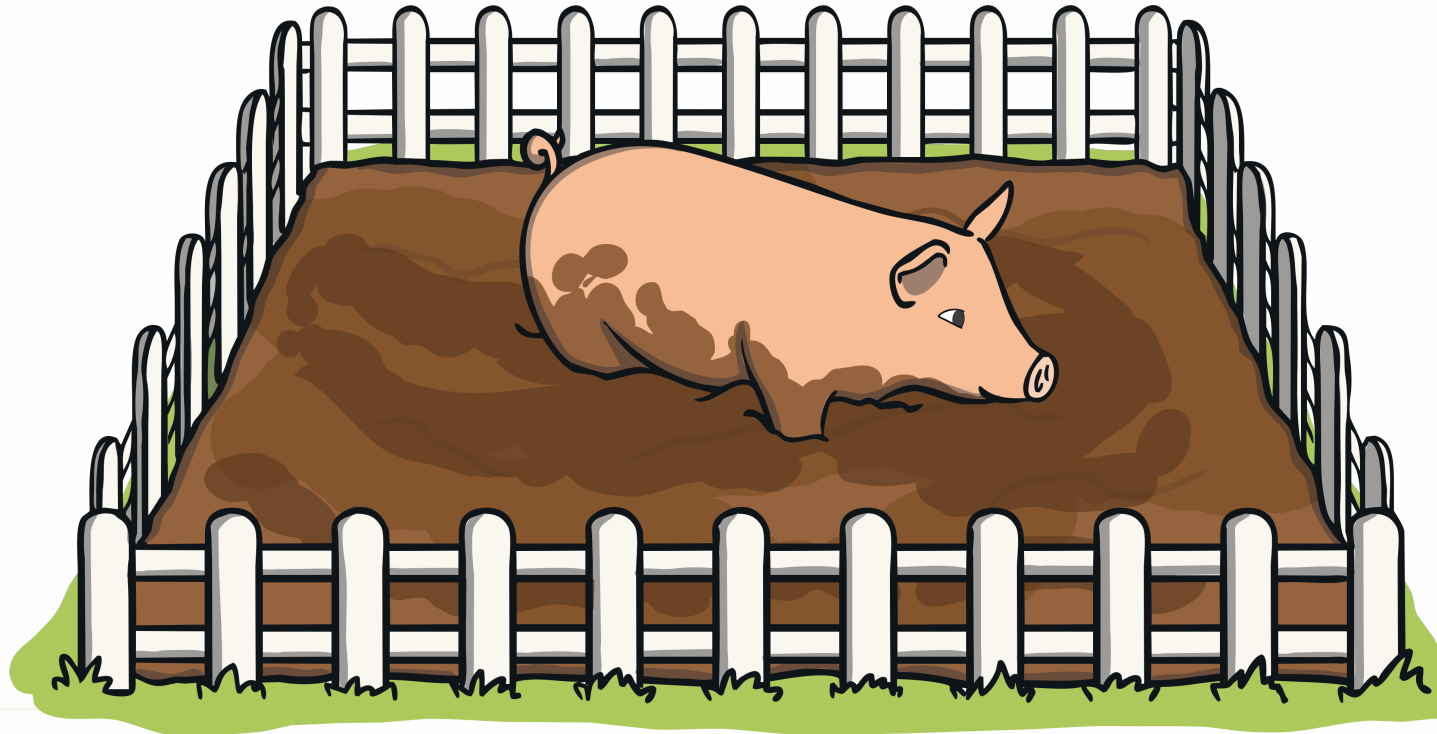


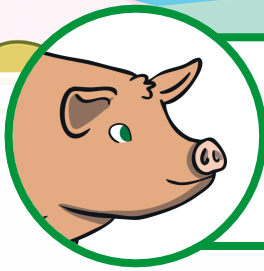
Pigs



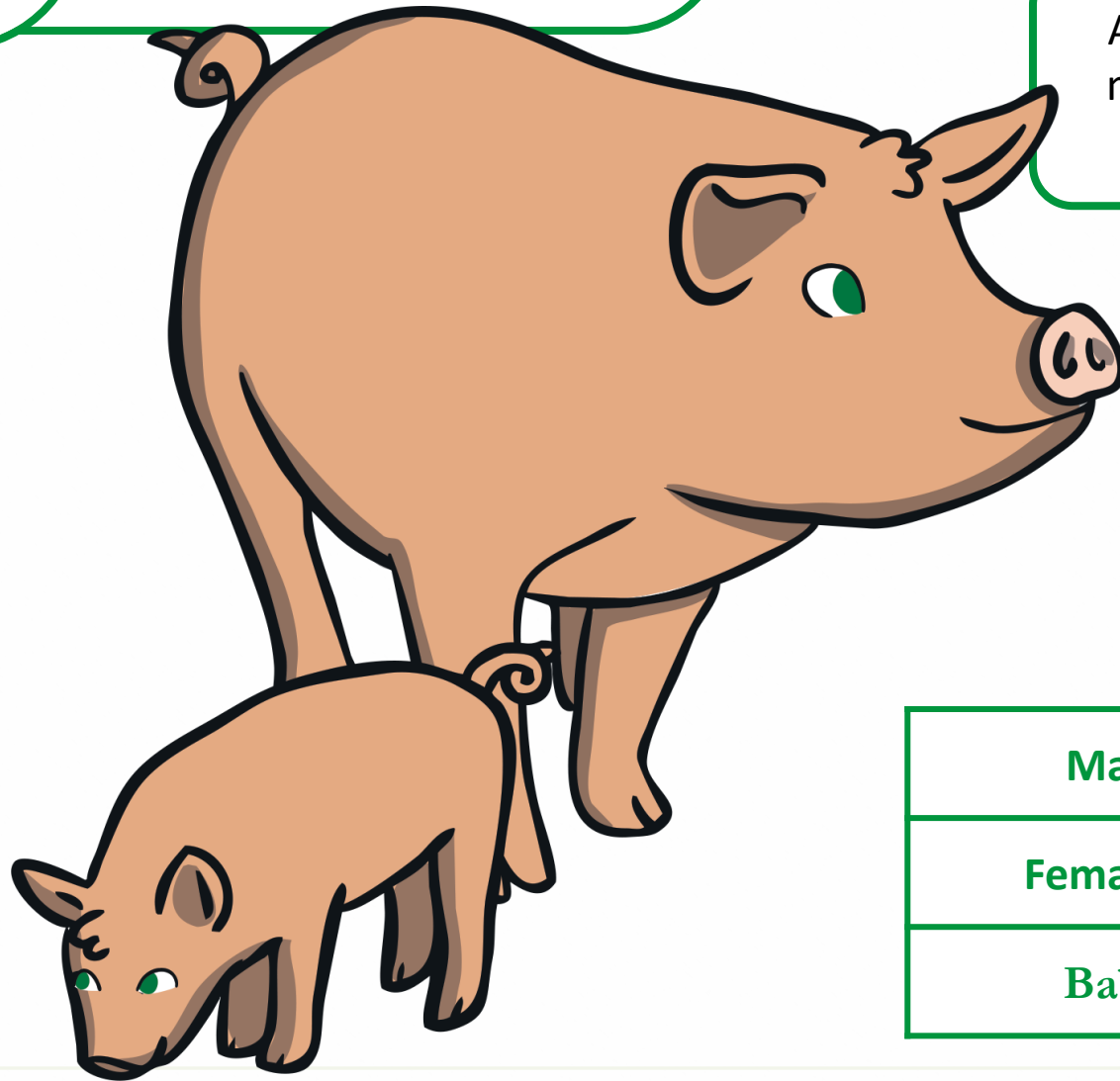
We get pork, bacon, and sausage from pigs.

Pigs live in a pen called a pigsty. It is usually filled with dirt or mud. Pigs like to roll and lay in the mud, because it helps them stay cool. They can't sweat like other animals to keep their bodies cool.
