The story is called 'The Centurion's Servant'.



As you listen or read, I want you to think about what the Centurion said to Jesus and how.

One day, after Jesus had finished preaching to a large crowd of people, He came down from the mountain and went into the town of Capernaum. The streets were busy but one important man was not out with the crowds. A Roman soldier sat inside at the side of his much beloved servant's bed. This soldier was a centurion, meaning he was in charge of 100 men when they went to battle. The centurion was well respected by everyone in Capernaum because he treated everyone fairly.





Despite his importance, the centurion was at home caring for one of his servants who was very sick. The centurion knew that, without a miracle, the servant would die. Suddenly, the centurion heard lots of noise in the street below. The centurion listened to hear what the shouting was all about. He heard cries of "Jesus!" People were shouting "Jesus is here! Jesus is coming!" The centurion had heard all about Jesus. Recently stories of Jesus healing the sick and even raising a man from the dead had reached the town.




The centurion knew this was his only chance. He did not wish to leave his sick servant's side, so he asked some of his friends to find Jesus and beg for his help.

The friends soon found Jesus and they begged Him to come with them and heal the centurion's dying servant. They said, "If anyone deserves your help, it is this man. He loves the Jews and even paid personally to build us a synagogue." After listening intently to the men, Jesus said, "I will come and heal his servant."

Please do not come to my house, worthy.

Not far from the house, more friends of the centurion arrived with a message for Jesus. The message told Jesus not to come to the house, for the centurion did not feel he was worthy to welcome such a great man into his house. "Just speak a word, and I know my dear servant will be healed," the centurion's message read.



When Jesus read the centurion's words. He marvelled at the man's faith. He was delighted that the centurion would believe that just one word from Jesus could heal a man. He turned to the crowd and said, "Never among all the Jews in Israel have I met a man with faith like this." Jesus healed the centurion's servant with just a word. It was a miracle!
