
All about Michael Rosen



Remember a synonym is a word that means the same.





Activity 4: What did you think?







Now that you have read – and performed - this fabulous poem, I'd like to know what you think of it. Use the questions on the next page to help you explain your ideas.


- Did you like the poem? Why/ why not?
