Doves appear in lots of stories in the Bible. In the New Testament, the dove is a symbol of the Holy Spirit. It reminds us of peace, love and being free from sin.






Can you think of another Bible story we have looked at in which a dove played an important part? Hint: It was in the Old Testament.

1 - Cut a paper plate in half.






2 - Put the two halves together and cut about a third off like this . . .







5 - Take one of the smaller pieces of plate, cut a slit in the edge and pull it together to make it more 3D. Bend the top over to make a beak. 6 - Use the other smaller part of the paper plate to make the tail.





3 - Cut a slit in the centre of both of the larger parts and pull these together to make the wings look more 3D.
