There are only 5 spellings for this week.

Spelling pattern:

This week, we are looking at the prefix 'dis'.

- A **prefix** is a letter or letters added to the start of a word to change its meaning.
- 'Dis' means 'not' or 'the opposite of'. It will give the word the opposite meaning.

For example:

disagree This is the opposite of agree. It means that you have a different opinion on something compared to somebody else.

Symmetry Spelling Activity

Write your word on one side of the line, then flip it and write the mirror image of the word on the other side of the line. Practise spelling and symmetry.
