









Art from Everyday objects and Materials week 5






Over the next few weeks, we will be exploring the work of artists who use very ordinary objects and materials to make exciting and imaginative pieces of artwork.

Victor Nunes




Born in Brazil in 1945.

Challenge: KSI: Can you find Brazil on a World Map? (Clue: It's in South America). KS2: Can you name the 3 other countries in South America?



Victor Nunes combines everyday objects with simple illustrations to turn them into pictures of faces, animals and other playful scenes.



Look carefully. What object has been used as a starting point? What has Victor Nunes turned the objects into?





Look what he can create with a pair of scissors.





Victor Nunes doesn't throw away his pencil 'sharpenings'...he makes pictures with them!

Can you explain why?






Here is one way that Victor Nunes has combined a pen top with a drawing to make a face. Click on the link below to see other pictures he makes with the same object.
