




Book Recommendations for Years 5 and 6:



Together, Lucy and Milo become entwined in a mystery that threatens to engulf the whole town of Sticky Pines and its weird and wonderful residents.






Book Recommendations for Years 3 and 4:





With fantastic illustrations within each chapter, which bring the story to life, get ready to join them on their adventure into The Land of Roar. 



Chapter Book Recommendations for Years 1 and 2:



Recommendations for Year 1 and EYFS:
