Miss Robertson's example:

Miss Robertson's example:

Problem: One day, the boy woke up. He quickly raced downstairs to see his beloved pets. To his horror, all of the birds were nowhere to be seen.

All of sudden, he knew what he needed to do. He realised that the birds were happiest when they were flying freely. They didn't need to be trapped in cages.
