Happy Monday! I hope you are all okay and have had a lovely weekend.


Before you work through today's activities. Watch the video of reading the Stone Age Boy story. Enjoy!

In today's lesson, you are going to think about different parts of the story and make some inferences about how the main character in the story, the boy, feels.



Inference is when you read between the lines and look for clues in a story.

Today, we are going to be looking at different parts of the story and using **inference skills** to think about how the main character is feeling/ what he might be thinking.

I have circled some key information to help you.


When I woke up, I was in a cold, dark place.
I could see daylight in the distance and I stumbled towards it.

How is the boy feeling? What is he thinking? How do we know this from the text?

Miss Robertson's example:

Can you use any evidence from the text? \(\bigs\)

Feelings:	Thoughts:	Justification (reason):
confused, nervous, scared,	What has happened to me?	He is thinking and feeling these things
Remember, use adjectives to describe the characters' feelings. Put yourself in his shoes.	How have I ended up here? Remember, imagine you are the character, what is going through your head.	because he has tripped and fallen into an unknown place. It is 'cold and dark' and he doesn't know where he is.



How is the boy feeling? What is he thinking? How do we know this from the text?

Miss Robertson's example:


Feelings:	Thoughts:	Justification (reason):
Relieved, curious, confused	I wonder who this girl is. Why does she look so different to me?	He is relieved because he has found someone but he is confused/ curious because the girl looks nothing like anyone else he knows.



The air felt ... different. Warmer.


I walked a long way, calling for Om. But I never found her.
