The Lion Man information page

The sculpture was discovered in Germany in 1939 (at the start of WW2).

It is made from mammoth tusks.

It is about 31 cm tall (about the size of the rulers we use in school.) cave lion but a partly human body.

It was discovered by an archaeologist who was investigating caves. The sculpture is thought to be 40,000 years old and was made in the Paleolithic Stone Age (old Stone Age).


