Types of sentences



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

Different types of sentences

There are 4 types of sentences:

- Statement
- Question
- Command
- Exclamation



Depending on the sentence type, different punctuation is used. Today, we will be using 3 different forms of punctuation.

Full stop






Question mark



Exclamation mark



You will also be needing your capital letters too.


Statement

A statement is a sentence that simply tells the reader something.

The dog was growling.



A statement contains a subject (person, place, thing or idea) and a verb (action) and usually ends in a full stop.



Question

A question is a type of sentence that we ask or write to gain further information about something.

Question sentences end with a question mark.

Often, but not always, question sentences begin with one of the following words:

- Who
- What
- Where
- When
- Why
- How

How are you?
Who is that?
What is happening?

Question sentences can also begin with other words to like:

Do you have a pet?

Are you going to take your coat?

Command

A command is when you are telling someone to do something. Commands usually start with a verb.

They are found in instructions but can also be urgent or angry and can be very short.

Go and brush your teeth!

Imperative (bossy) verb

Exclamation mark

Commands can be punctuated with a full stop or exclamation mark. For example:

Please go and tidy your room.

Exclamation

An exclamation usually begins with 'what' or 'how'. It is a full sentence, including a verb, which ends in an exclamation mark.

How exciting the zoo is!



What amazing children you are!




The next few activities are based on the first few pages of the book.

And I don't think I looked like any of the boys she knew.











