

Here are some questions to get you thinking:


- 1. How tall is he?

wears a toga. Remus sometimes wears gold
bracelets. Remus has bushy eyebrows. Remus
has large ears.

The writer has started every sentence with 'Remus'. This is very repetitive, can you use some pronouns instead? For example; 'He' or 'his'
