

Luke 2:22-40 (Adapted for Children)

Joseph and Mary brought baby Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem, (as it is written in the Law of the Lord, "Every firstborn male is to be consecrated to the Lord"). He was their firstborn son. Even as a baby, Jesus was fulfilling God's law! While they were in the temple a man named Simeon approached them. God had made a special promise to Simeon saying that he would get to see the promised Messiah before he died. What an amazing promise that was! When Simeon saw the baby Jesus in Mary's arms he knew the wait for the Messiah was over.

Simeon took Jesus in his arms and praised God, saying:

"Sovereign Lord, as you have promised, you may now dismiss your servant in peace."

For my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the sight of all nations: a light for revelation to the Gentiles and the glory of your people Israel."

Simeon had been promised by God that he would see the Messiah (Jesus) before he died, so he told God he could die in peace now as he had seen the Messiah, baby Jesus at the Temple.

The child's father and mother marvelled at what was said about Jesus. Then Simeon blessed them and said to Mary,


"This child is destined to cause the falling and rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be spoken against, so that the thoughts of many hearts will be revealed. And a sword will pierce your own soul too."

Simeon was a prophet (he could give messages from God about the future). He was telling Mary that Jesus would save Israel but that Mary would suffer because of this, meaning when Jesus would die on the cross many years later.
