## Who can come and point to Tower Bridge?



This is a compass rose. It shows four different directions: North, South, East and West. Compass roses like this one are often shown on maps to help people navigate from place to place.


North


We can use directional language, including North, South, East and West, to direct between two places on a map.


Have a look at this map of a village. Which direction would you travel on the map to get from Jamie's house to Habib's house?


You would travel SOUTH to get from Jamie's house to Habib's house. Did you get that right?
