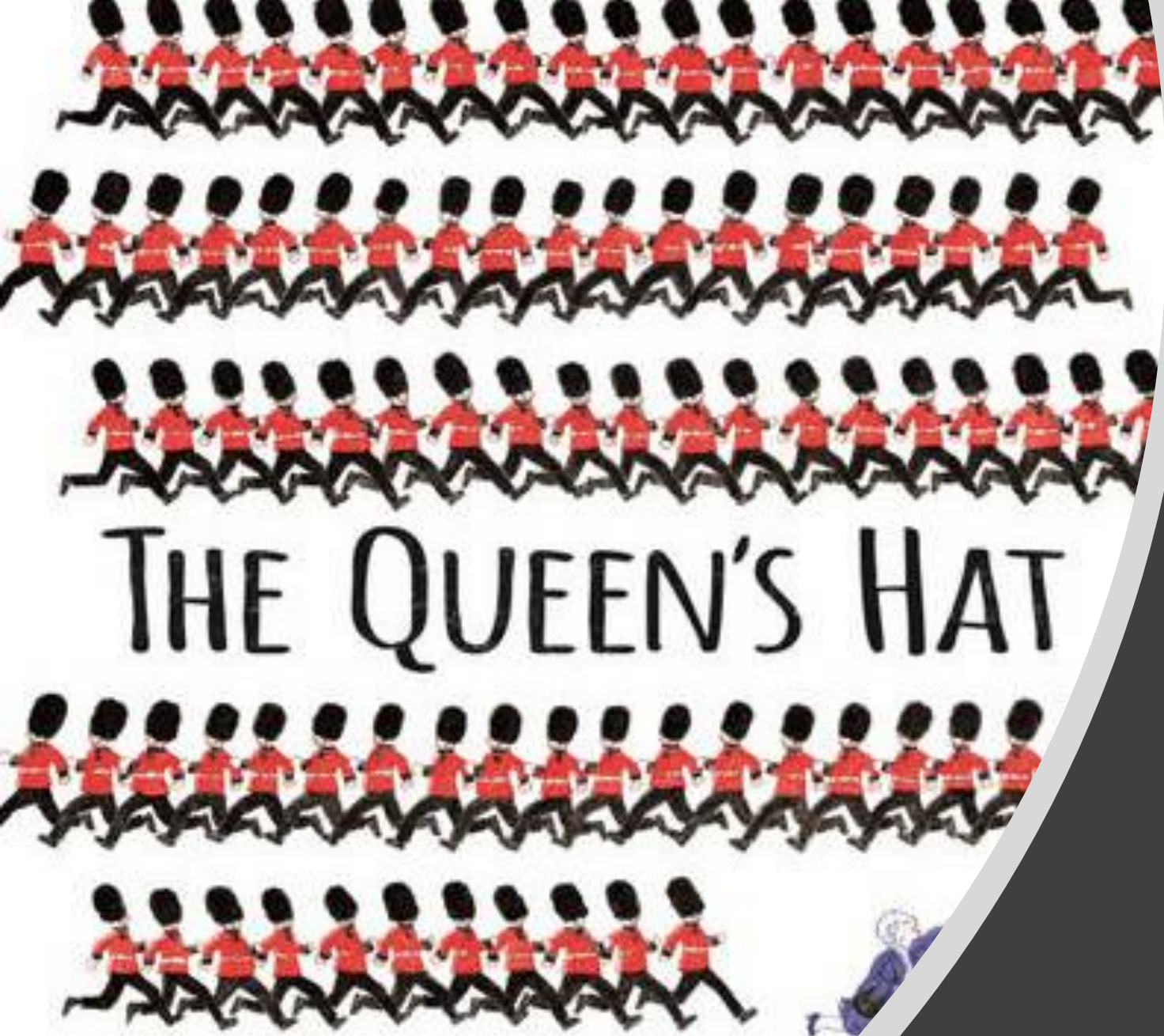

Ding! Dong! Big **B**en chimed 3 o'clock.



Use noisy words here, such as:
ding, dong, clang, bong, bang



Remember capital letters
for names. (Big Ben)

Here's my example:

'I'll never get it back now,' thought the Queen.



What is the Queen thinking?

It's gone forever.

How will I ever get it back now?

In Part 3, we will describe how the guards floated down from the sky.

Down, down, down. The guards **slowly** floated down from the sky.



Repeating the word, 'Down' makes the writing more interesting. It suggests that they came down slowly or had a long way to go.



Use an **adverb** (*slowly, gently, calmly, elegantly*) which describes **how** the guards floated.
