What is deforestation?

Around 30% of the earth is covered by trees. Rainforests cover only 6% of the earth but they are hom to rearch u I co of all plant and animal species. Deforestation happens when trees are cut down on a massive scale. The land is then given another use, such as building housing, growing crops, logging or cattle grazing

Every minute, trees in an area of rainforest the size of 30 football pitches are cut down! If this continues, there will be no rainforests left 100 years from now.

Possible Effects of Deforestation

Soil Erosion Tree roots help hold the soil and prevent it from being washed away into rivers. This can cause flooding and dirty

when they are cut drinking water.

Climate Change Scientists believe that deforestation affects our climate. Trees store carbon dioxide and,
