Multiplication and division

Multiply and divide numbers mentally drawing upon known facts; multiply numbers up to 4 digits by a one- or two-digit number using a formal written method, including long multiplication for two-digit numbers; divide numbers up to 4 digits by a one-digit number using the formal written method of short division and interpret remainders appropriately. Solve problems with multiplication and division.

Multiply fractions unit/non-unit/mixed numbers by an integer, calculate fractions of amounts.

English

Focus: The Good Samaritan (retell). **Skill:** Use short sentences to build suspense.

Focus: The Chocolate Tree by Linda Lowery (retell and persuasive letter). **Skills:** Use show don't tell to build suspense, to introduce a dilemma in a story and convey a character's emotions, use noun phrases with a modifier, choosing words carefully to really 'show' the reader what I am describing, use modal verbs and adverbs to show the possibility of something happening, use a rhetorical question to make the reader think.

Focus: Bruce eating the chocolate cake from the film Matilda (retell). **Skills:** describing settings, characters and atmosphere and integrating dialogue to advance the action.

Focus: Haiku – Nature. **Skill:** Syllable focus


