English – Reading & Writing

Harry Potter Topic Mixed genres: Descriptive writing, research, non-chronological reports, diary writing, persuasive writing, poetry. Decimals and percentages

Decimals up to 2 decimal places, equivalent decimals and fractions (tenths, hundredths, thousandths), order and compare decimals, round decimals, understand percentages, percentages as fractions and decimals, equivalent fraction, decimal, percentages

Calculate perimeter of rectangles and rectilinear shapes, perimeter of polygons, areas of rectangles and compound shapes, estimate the area of irregular shapes. Use standard units, square centimetres (cm²) and square metres (m²)

Solve comparison, sum and difference problems using information presented in a line graph; complete, read and interpret information in tables, including timetables.
