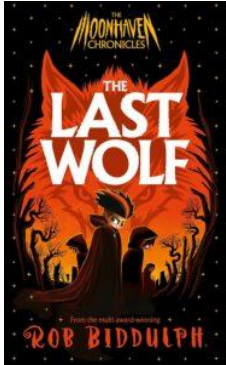

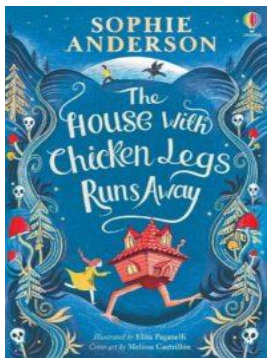
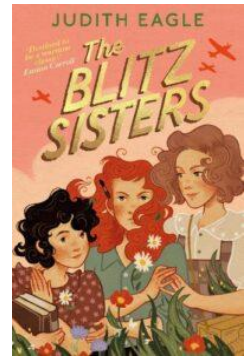
## Book recommendations for Easter

### Books for readers in UKS2



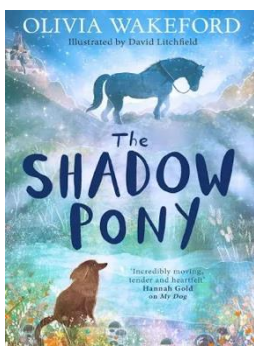
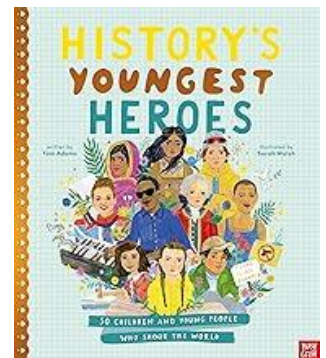
