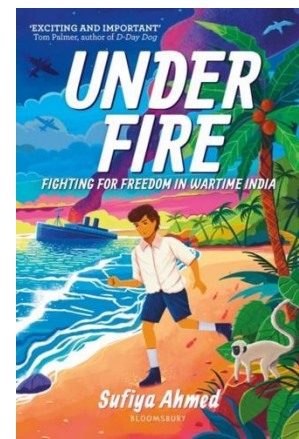
Book Recommendations for Y5 & Y6

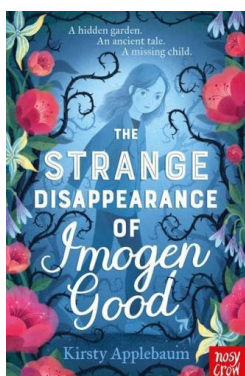
