Accept any reasonable explanation regarding Emma viewing dad as boring because he will not let her get a dog.

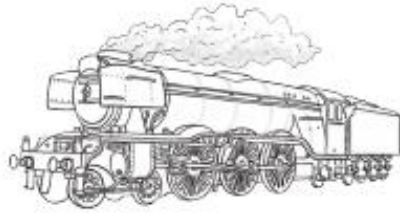


3. What makes you think that Emma is not ready to get a puppy? Use evidence from the text.
