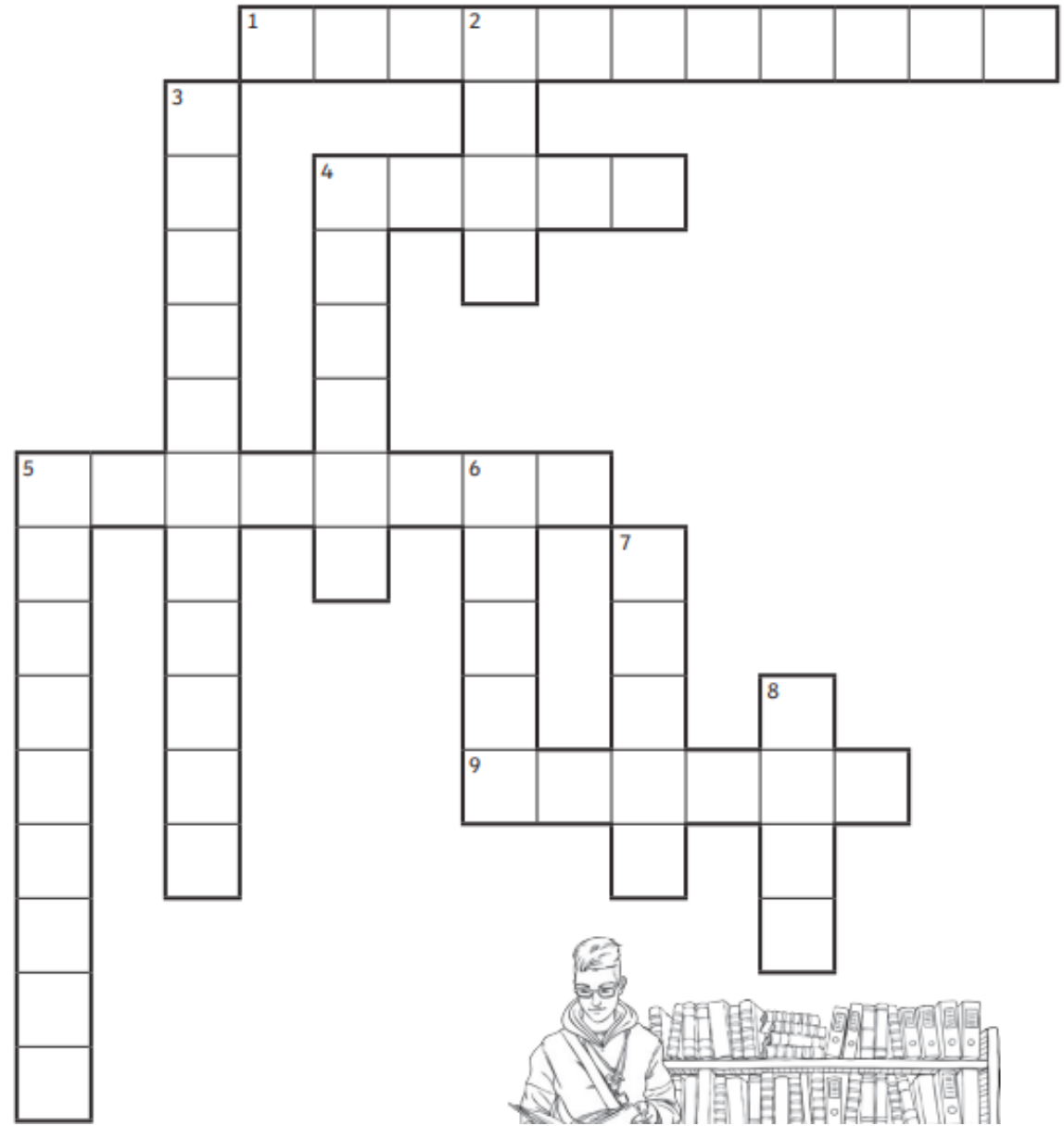

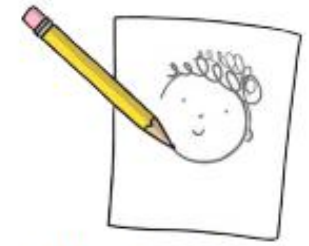

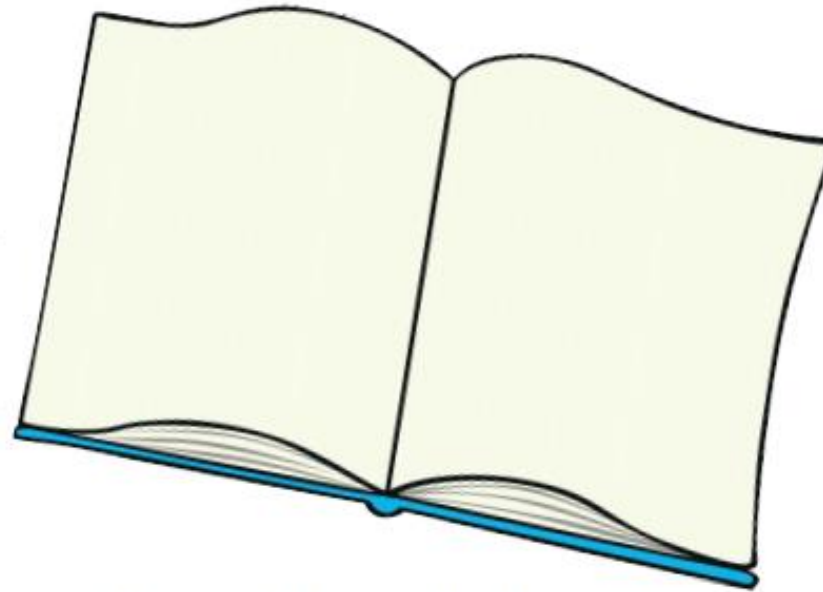

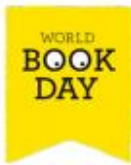

- **Write a letter to your favourite author**
